When you paint someone's portrait, it's not usually a good idea to make fun of them, especially if that person is one of the rich and powerful. a...2..... . It was lucky for one painter that Rudolf II had





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a sense of humor, because his painting of the king had a pear for a nose, corn on the cob for ears and cherry lips! In fact, the 16th century portrait was actually a painting of fruit, vegetables and plants which were arranged to look like the king's face. This was the work of Italian artist Guiseppe Arcimboldo.

2 _E- More difficult than it seems_____

Arcimboldo was born in Milan and worked at the royal court in Vienna, Austria, where he developed the style and the technique which made him famous. It looks simple, painting an apple for a cheek, a lettuce for a shoulder, but in fact Arcimboldo, like Leonardo da Vinci before him, had studied the human body and the natural world. **b...4.....** . *Winter* portrays an old man, his face made up of tree bark and branches, along with fruit and vegetables that only grow in the coldest months. The profile of Spring contains signs of life, like new leaves and blossoms.
