Object Pronouns - me, you, him, her, it, us, you, them serve as the object of a verb.

We can say: "Mary is American" Or we can say: "She is American".

In some cases the OBJECT PRONOUN is different from the SUBJECT PRONOUN. Look at the table below:

SUBJECT	OBJECT
I	me
you	you
he	him
she	her
it	it
we	us
you	you
they	them

EXAMPLES:

-Am I talking to you?

Yes, you are talking to me.

-Is she looking at **him** or **her**?

She's looking at him.

- -We are listening to you.
- -Who is she speaking to?

-Are they looking at **us**?

No, we are looking at them.




